April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month

The <u>National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's</u> annual National Distracted Driving Awareness Month shines the spotlight on the toll distracted driving takes on our nation's roads runs April 1–30.

Each year, more than **3,000** Americans are killed in distracted driving crashes and the economic toll of all motor vehicle crashes in the U.S. annually exceeds **\$400 billion**.

Here in Minnesota, the dangerous choice to drive distracted contributed to more than **39,000 crashes** from 2017–2021. That translates to nearly **30 deaths** and more than **160 serious**, **life-changing injuries** annually on our state's roads.

Minnesota NETS has compiled <u>educational materials</u> and tools to support workplace distracted driving campaigns so you can remind employees and others of the dangers of distracted driving and spread the message that when you are behind the wheel, your only job is to drive. You can:

Construction and repair work typically begins in earnest in April, along with projects next to or near our roadways. <u>National Work Zone Awareness Week</u> — this year from April 17–21 — is a great time to remind people to Go Orange all year around!

All roadway safety professionals across the country are encouraged to wear orange on Go Orange Wednesday, April 19 to proudly show their support of work zone safety. Help get the word out by:

You can find our Minnesota NETS campaign materials <u>here</u>. It's also a great time for a refresher with eight work zone safety driving tips from the Minnesota Department of Transportation:

- 1. Obey posted speed limits.
- The fine for speeding in a work zone is \$300.
- 2. Drive undistracted.
- 3. Stay alert, especially at night.
- 4. Be patient.
- 5. Expect work zones to constantly change.
- 6. Don't make unnecessary lane changes.
- 7. Do the zipper merge.
- 8. Never enter a road blocked with barriers or cones.
