


New Year, New Plans for Safer Roads

Save a Life by Sharing a Video

The Minnesota Department of Public Safety and Department of Transportation produced a [30-minute Video](#) in partnership with the cities of Minneapolis and Mendota Heights — part of a new pilot program in Minnesota called the Traffic Safety Camera System Pilot Program.

Although the video is used as a diversion option in lieu of paying a traffic citation, the highlighted safety messages are relevant for all drivers. Topics addressed in the video include speeding, especially in work zones and school zones, impairment, distraction, and the importance of wearing a seat belt. Please share this video widely.


Empowering Passengers to Speak Up

National Passenger Safety Week: Jan. 19 – 26, 2026

National Passenger Safety Week promotes safe driving practices and prevents unsafe ones by empowering passengers to **SPEAK UP** when their lives are in danger due to a reckless driver. Launched by the advocacy groups We Save Lives and the National Road Safety Foundation, the annual National Passenger Safety Campaign brings together more than 60 organizations that believe it's time to focus on the passenger, and not just the driver. In 2023, NHTSA added the campaign to their national calendar.

Passengers can make a difference! National Passenger Safety Week shifts the traditional mindset from the silent passenger to a passenger that intervenes and voices their concerns when they don't feel safe with a driver's risky actions — like not wearing a seat belt, speeding, driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, or texting while driving.

2026 GHSA Annual Meeting Coming to MN!

Minneapolis will welcome the Governors Highway Safety Association (GHSA) and the nation's state and territorial highway traffic safety leaders August 29 – September 2 for the 2026 GHSA Annual Meeting.

From Data to Action: Harnessing the Technology Revolution is the theme this year, which will focus on the need to advance innovative tools that can change the traffic safety game and save countless lives on our roads. The 2026 GHSA Annual Meeting is expected to draw more than 850 traffic safety professionals. This meeting will replace the Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) State Conference for 2026.

GHSA, a nonprofit representing the state and territorial highway safety offices that implement federal grant programs, leads states and territories toward zero traffic deaths through leadership, partnerships and advocacy.
